Rescue report

Someday I will learn to keep my mouth shut. No sooner did I say that there were not any dogs being boarded than it began raining Golden retrievers!

First to arrive was **Cutty #651**, a beautiful 4 year old boy whose family felt they did not have enough time for him, and besides, he sheds. **Cutty** was lucky because one of the newest vets at **Clint Moore, Dr. Goodman**, decided to foster for **EGRR**, and he became her very first foster dog. Next was **Clancy #652**, a 3 year old Heartworm positive boy from **Palm Beach County ACC**. We thought we had a foster-to-adopt home for him, but after leaving the kennel with **Clancy**, the family decided that having to keep an active 3 year old dog quiet for a year was more than they could handle. **Clancy** is now back in the kennel where he was quickly joined by four other dogs. These other new dogs are 10 year old **Parker #653** from **Palm Beach County ACC**, 2 year old **Olivia #654** and her "brother", 15 month old **Alisis/Alex #655**, from the **Coral Springs Humane Unit**, and 4 year old, Heartworm positive, **Cookie #656** from **Broward County ACC**. **Olivia** and **Alex** were running loose in the streets of **Coral Springs** where they were most likely dumped by their owners after her recent litter was weaned. The owners initially denied that they were their dogs, but eventually admitted it, stating that they did not want the dogs back. The puppies were being sold from a carton by the side of the road. We had hoped that the puppies could be confiscated and turned over to us, but we have heard nothing so we imagine they were all sold.

Cheers/Chloe #650 was returned to rescue because her new family found her too difficult to deal with. They had hired a private trainer but were having trouble following up with the practice sessions. **Cheers/Chloe** is in foster care with an **EGRR Board** member, who is working very hard with her on manners, but she is a handful. **Bambi #618** continues to make progress in her foster home. **Connor #638** is still waiting for a negative heartworm test, so he can be adopted by his foster-to-adopt family. **Nemo #649** still has several months of treatment before he can be retested for this preventable disease. With the addition of **Cookie**, we now have had six heartworm positive dogs this year, averaging one per month. Last year we only had two the entire year. We wonder if the economy is causing people to skimp on heartworm protection or if other factors are coming into play.

Chachi #644 and **Princess #645** are still living in their wonderful foster home. The longer they stay there, the more likely it is that they are not going to leave. We have our paws crossed that the adoption happens! **Rex #642**, who came to us as a "wild child" was tuned into a gentleman by his wonderful foster mom and has gone to his "forever" home.

Two **EGRR** dogs have gone to the **Bridge** this month. **Golden #612**, who was surrendered to us by his heartbroken family when they lost their home, broke the heart of another family when he lost his battle with the seizures that had plagued him for so long. **Dakota #475** also lost her long battle with cancer and made the trip to the **Bridge** where she joined the family's previous **EGRR** Golden, **Little Bear #413**, for whom our special cancer fund is named.

Gloria Kerr **Arizona** fee is depending on the size of specialty **Juniors** **yes**

Gloria Kerr, of Arizona USA, began her interest in dogs as a child and was introduced to dog shows in 1962 with a Golden Retriever puppy named Krishna's Golden Hunter CD or "Charlie". From the acquisition of this single dog grew the love of the both the Golden Retriever and the Dog Show World.

She has since bred and titled numerous conformation champions under the name of Krishna Kennels. Several famous USA Golden Kennels are founded on her Krishna dogs. She has bred many champions in Golden Retrievers, Akitas, Pembroke Welsh Corgis and Chinese Cresteds. She has shown many of them to Conformation Best In Show and Best In Specialty wins. In Obedience, she had multiple obedience titleholders and also trained for working certificates, (WC) in the field with her Goldens.

In 1971, Gloria established the Palo Verde Golden Retriever Club of Tucson, was president for several years and taught many obedience and all breed conformation and handling classes. She was on the board of the Tucson Kennel Club and was president and is currently on the board of the Canada Del Oro Kennel Club of Tucson. Most recently she is President of a new all breed club, the Madera Canyon Kennel Club.

Gloria became an AKC licensed professional handler in 1974 and has handled, finished, and specialed dogs in every AKC group. In 2000 she became an AKC licensed judge and is now approved for Junior Showmanship, Sporting Group, Herding Group, and Toy Group along with several breeds in the Working Group and Best In Show. She has judged throughout the world in Australia, Korea, Taiwan, China, Canada, Columbia, So.America.

She has been honored to judge Golden Retriever National Specialties in the USA, Korea and Canada and the Chinese Crested National Specialty in the USA.

During the past few years, she has given Handling Seminars throughout the USA and has many graduates who have gone on to be great handlers.

Her heart is with the Golden Retriever. She feels committed to bettering the breed by keeping in mind the purpose and origin of the breed. Her concept of the Golden Retriever is best expressed by an "old time breeder" who said "Conformation is a map, not a destination. Movement is the final determination of the best conformation".

Colonel Jon Chase **Kentucky** **Juniors** **yes**

Colonel Chase has been actively training and showing dogs since the early 1970's even though his military career restricted participation to but a few dogs. Both he and his wife Kathy train for conformation and performance and until moving to Kentucky in 2006, handled their own dogs in both venues. They breed and show under the Mariner prefix and are proud Mariner Kennels continually produces quality Golden Retrievers equally at home in the show ring, the duck blind or resting comfortable on the family couch.

He is a long time member (29 years) of the Golden Retriever Club of America, the Irish Setter Club of America, Yankee Golden Retriever Club, Golden Retriever Club of Greater Louisville, Mayflower Pembroke Welsh Corgi Club and the Lexington Kennel Club. Furthermore, he and his wife Kathy are founders and board members of the Nicholas County Animal Welfare Society, which is just the past year (2010) alone has placed over 500 strays and unwanted dogs in loving homes.

Colonel Chase served 25 years as a commissioned officer in the United States Marine Corps, holds a master degree in Exercise Physiology and resides with his wife on a small horse farm near Lexington, Kentucky. He is also active in the Hunter/Jumper community and enjoys competing with his Thoroughbreds across the south

Since 1982 I have been the proud owner of Golden Retrievers. My Golden Retriever family is currently seven dogs each receiving basic field training and basic agility training regardless of what area of competition they enter.

In February 1994, I was approved as an AKC agility judge (one of the original 20 judges) for all levels and have judged both the Golden Retriever National Specialty (2001 and 2004) and the AKC National Agility Championships. Golden Retriever Bio

I got my first Golden Retriever when I was in the 7th grade – many, many years ago. Her name was Tara of Meadowbrook and she was a puppy from the people 2 houses up. I don't think we paid for her. She was totally untrained (or rather she had us well-trained - she would only come when offered a piece of Wonder bread).

We lived in Minnesota and her favorite thing was to go down to the 'swamp' a block away and retrieve box turtles. She slept on my bed and when I was away at college she disappeared - to that 'farm'! So much for responsible dog ownership. I started showing dogs in 1977 (Alaskan Malamutes) and got my first Golden in 1989 - Ch. Golden Light Always Vigilant CD WC VC. Great dog.

Our first two Golden Retrievers, (same breeding), were both dysplastic although symptomless. What seemed like a tragedy was a blessing - it meant I could not go out and breed just because I owned some Champions. I had to actually pay attention to what was important.

Bill and I have finished 6 Golden Retrievers we acquired from other people and have bred 46 conformation champions to date. Sunbeam dogs also have agility, obedience and hunting titles - no tracking yet! We have a limited breeding program and co-own all dogs we breed - not because we want anything back but because we are always responsible for them.

Golden Retrievers are my passion. I love them to look at, to sleep with and to be around. I always try to keep in mind they are first and foremost hunting dogs and so they should always remain functional and have the temperament one would expect of a gentleman's hunting companion. The dogs and the friends I have made through dogs have truly enriched my life. I love judging Sweeps (and I really am going to get in my application to judge by the end of the year - of course I say that every year) and I am honored to be considered by the Everglades Golden Retriever Club. I have done 6 Sweeps before and think I do a competent job of running a ring as well as judging dogs. There are at least 4 people (counting veterans) at each Sweeps who agree with me.

I believe Bill and I were at one of the first events in Florida - an Eastern Regional (MFGRC) where you put up orange snow fencing to keep the alligators out. I still did the GR Review then and we held a Futurity as well. Quite a memory.

I have been involved with dogs my entire life. My mother, Connie Gerstner Miller owned a kennel in DeForest, Wisconsin. Connie was also an all-breed professional handler and is the breeder of "Malagold" Golden Retrievers.
